Boy drowns in Cazaville

A young boy only six years old drowned in a pond around 3:45 p.m. on Saturday, May 12 in Cazaville.

His name was Martin Deschamps, son of Gerald Deschamps, residing at 2648 Montée Cazaville in the municipality of St. Anicet.

The tragic incident occurred in a sand quarry behind the property of Renaud Caza when the tractor driven by the victim's father overturned into a pond.

Gerald Deschamps had gone there to move some rocks and do some other odd jobs. With him on the backhoe were his son Martin and a young brother-in-law.

When the tractor overturned into the pond, Gerald Deschamps was able to swim to safety with his brother-in-law hanging

on to him. Martin had grabbed his father's jacket but, at one point, he let go.

Deschamps went back to try and save his son but Martin had disappeared underwater. In spite of considerable efforts, the boy couldn't be located.

It was only around 6:45 p.m. that, with the help of volunteers and the St. Anicet firemen, the body of the young victim was recovered by Marcel Russell and Marcel Deschambeault.

Officer Michel Leroux of the Huntingdon detachment of the Provincial police, called to the scene to lend assistance, was put in charge of the investigation of this tragic accident.

A funeral service for Martin Deschamps was held in the church of the Saint Anicet Parish on Tuesday, May 15 at 2 p.m.
