No doubt the kind loving care she received from all members of her family, especially from her sister Kathleen and her husband Gerry, helped her to feel self sufficient and a special part of their family without the sense of being a burden on anyone.

Helen's many talents were put to good use in domestic duties and in organizing ways to raise funds for many charities, both locally and for the missions elsewhere. I am sure her favorite one was in the Yukon, where her brother Hubert is bishop.

Her patient acceptance of her constant suffering had to be an inspiration and an influence in the choice of the various careers which her family pursued.

Helen was a tireless and efficient worker in the Catholic Women's League Society. She rallied the members to contribute some of their favorite recipes, which resulted in the sale of approximately 500 Recipe books, much appreciated by those lucky enough to purchase one.

She also started the custom of the Annual Card party usually held on Valentine's day, as well as the Strawberry Social held in early summer. The sale of cups and saucers depicting St. Joseph's Church was another pet project. Her telephone service to reach the different helpers kept her lines buzzing. She saw to

calling the members to prayer services at the funeral homes in the event of the death of anyone belonging to the League.

Though often unable lately to attend church services Helen had close contact with her God whom she so faithfully served.
