Robert Hawkins dies at the age of 97

Robert Hawkins of Smith Falls, Ont. passed away at the Riverview Nursing Home on Sunday, Dec. 8, 1985 at the age of 97.

Born at Iquique, Chile, he was the son of the late William Hawkins and his wife the late Katherine Watson.

He is survived by his wife, Andrie and daughters Mrs. Hugh McCabe (Jean), Mrs. Fred Andrews (Jessie), Mrs. Jack Gedyne-Friend (Peggy), Mrs. Norman Sinclair (Helen), Mrs. Keith Kealey (Janet), 15 grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren. He was predeceased by a son John.

Robert Hawkins came to Quebec from Scotland at an early age and worked in the Eastern Townships for several years. He later moved to Hemmingford where he purchased a farm on William Road. He lived there and farmed for some 40 years. He then moved to Oxford Mills, Ont. where upon his retirement he became the Township Assessor. Robert and his wife Andrie remained in Oxford Mills until 1980 when they moved to Smith Falls, and subsequently two years later moved into the Riverview Nursing Home where he lived until the time of his death.
