Herbert Foreman dies in his 96th year

Herbert Foreman, (always known as Herbie) passed away at the Centre d'accueil, Ormstown on Sunday May 31, 1987 in his 96th year.

Herbie had been born in England and for most of his childhood had been in an orphanage. He enlisted in the World War I army but was refused on account of his height. He then worked on the "Humber Training Ship", Southampton, Eng. When he was just 19 or 20

he came to Canada. He arrived at the farm of James and Allan Ritchie in Dewittville, Que, and remained with Allan Ritchie until 1949. After Mr. and Mrs. Ritchie retired he spent about 5 years with Mr. and Mrs. Irwin Todd helping with the farm chores.

He became ill and stayed for a short time in a home in Huntingdon.

When Mr. and Mrs. Otto Bulow moved to Dewitt-

ville he made his home with them for 20 years until his health failed and he went into the Centre d'accueil.

The funeral was held on Tuesday, June 2 from the Kelly Funeral Parlors in Huntingdon. Burial was in the Huntingdon Protestant Cemetery. Rev. Gordon Bannerman had charge of the Service.

The pallbearers were Otto Bulow, Royce Ruddock, John Whitehead, Hans Bulow, Peter Bulow and Melvin Graham.

Herbie was the last of the ones who came to Canada by boat in the early years of World War I.
