William John McCallum will be remembered

John McCallum was born on the family farm on the Ridge Road in Godmanchester, just north of the Huntingdon Town Line at the end of Dalhousie Street, the date was May 27, 1918. His father, Hugh, passed away from blood poisoning when John was ten years old, and he became the man of the house at a very early age.

John was a man of the land and worked his farm, which he loved, all of his lifetime. It seems appropriate that he was taken from us at harvest time. It is just as if the Lord were making his harvest, and much to the sorrow of this community, he reached out and picked the best of the crop.

Farming is not the easiest of professions at any time, and John was one who saw the good times and the bad. He was always able to fight off adversity and hard luck with hard work, faith in the future and good humour, which made him a special kind of man to his family, his friends and his neighbours.

Some of us will remember John as a baseball player, a big, strong right-fielder playing for the Constable and Huntingdon, teams. Some will remember him as a member and leader in the Godmanchester Volunteer Fire Department, which he served for so many years. His neighbours will remember him as a good neighbour, one who could be counted on to do his share at all times and sometimes more.

His friends in our community will remember him as someone who was pleasant to meet, easy to talk to, a wonderful host to any visitors to the family farm. He would always find time to visit with his nieces, nephews and grandchildren, children were attracted to him as were grownups.

He passed away early in the morning of August 13, 1987 in his sleep. He was exposed at the Kelly Funeral Home and hundreds of people from far and wide came to pay their respects. Before a full church a Funeral Mass at St. Joseph's Church in Huntingdon was held at eleven o'clock a.m. on August 15th. He was interred in the Church Cemetery.

He was a devoted family man and left to mourn him are his wife, Mary Proudfoot, three daughters, Dale (Mrs. Serge Mainville) of Ile Perrot, Janet (Mrs. Yves Rougerie) of Val D'Or and Lois of Montreal. He is also mourned by his two sons, Hugh, who operated the family farm with his father, and John (Jackie) of Huntingdon. There are also three grandchildren, Marc and Justin Mainville (Dale), and Marc McCallum (Jackie).

He is survived by four sisters and two brothers, Catherine (Mrs. Thomas Hurteau), of Massena, Rita of St. Marguerite, Claire (Mrs. William Bernhardt) of Ottawa, Eileen (Mrs. Alton Warden) of Mississauga, Hugh of Huntingdon and Walter of Trout River.

Dr. Lefebvre dies

Dentist Leo Lefebvre, 87 died recently in Canton, Illinois, following a lengthy illness. Born and raised in Huntingdon, Dr. Lefebvre completed his High School studies at Fort Covington, N.Y., and his university studies at Loyola University, in Chicago, Ill. He practised his profession

in Canton more than fifty years.

The youngest of a family of fifteen children, Dr Lefebvre was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs Ferdinand Lefebvre, of Huntingdon. The latter was a well-known tailor in Huntingdon around the

twenties and thirties. The deceased leaves his wife, Ethel Means, formerly of Fort-Covington, N.Y., two sons Dr. (dentist) Jack Lefebvre and Dick Lefebvre as well as one daughter Jean.

Funeral services and burial were held in Canton, Ill.
