In former years, while a resident of Ville de Lery, Ed enjoyed sailing, and formany years was an active member of the Woodland Yachting Club. He was originally from Montreal, and attended the L.C.C. (Lower Canada College) in Montreal.

He was a staunch member of the "Old Boys" Association, which met every year for a Class Reunion.
