Noel Edward Haydon — 25 Dec. 1917 — April 1992
The Valleyfield Community, along with many friends in the Valleyfield area extend deepest sympathy to the family of Edward Haydon.

Ed died unexpectedly on Thursday, April 30 while a patient in the Montreal General Memorial Hospital.

A Memorial funeral service was held on Tuesday, May 5, at St. Mark's Anglican Church, Valleyfield, and was well attended by family members and friends.

Fr. Majka officiated at the service and gave a very touching eulogy on Ed.

Special organist and singer for the occasion was Leigh Coffin, of St. James Church, Ormstown. He gave some delightful renditions of some of Ed's favorite songs.

Ed had a very jovial, pleasant personality.

Always a hard worker he put in long hours at his office, and for his churches. He also loved music, and taught himself to play the organ.

In March 1980, a short time after the death of his beloved first wife, Marjorie Lemessurier, in Ville de Lery, Ed met and married the former Hazel Nixon of Valleyfield and took up residence here.

For many years he had been a popular Lay Reader at Trinity Church in Beauharnois, and on his arrival here he continued this service at St. Mark's, becoming very involved with the church's activities. He was also the Treasurer and on occasion filled in as organist.

Just last year Ed was especially honored by the presentation of the "Bishop's Award" and Plaque, by the Rt. Rev. Andrew Hutchinson, the new Anglican Bishop of Montreal for his long and dedicated service to the churches in this diocese.

In former years, while a resident of Ville de Lery, Ed enjoyed sailing, and for many years was an active member of the Woodlawn Yachting Club.

He was originally from Montreal, and attended the L.C.C. (Lower Canada College) in Montreal.

He was a staunch member of the "Old Boys" Association, which met every year for a Class Reunion.

Sadly, there are now only four members remaining. Three others passed away earlier this year.

Sympathy is extended to his beloved wife, Hazel; his sons, Edward (Ted), Robert, Richard and his dear daughter, Barbara (Corbett), of Ville de Lery; also his brother, Carswell; sister, Barbara (Sutherland), and half brothers, John and Roy. Also his ten grandchildren and numerous nieces and nephews.

Ed's ashes will be laid to rest either in Beauharnois or Valleyfield, at a future date.

He will be sadly missed by this community and those whose lives he touched in some small way.

entered into Holy matrimony.

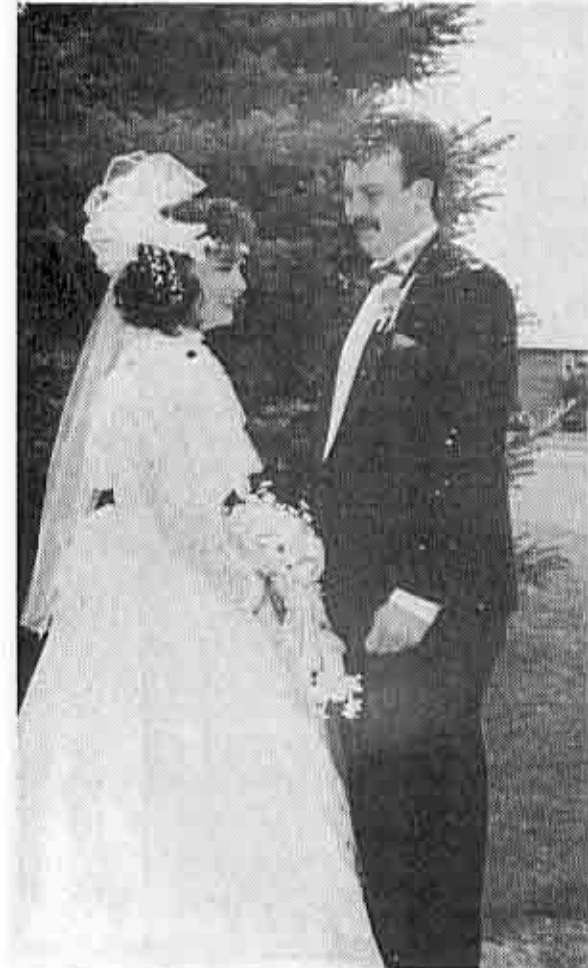
