

On October 31, 1999, my wife and I made the final offer to purchase our house in Huntingdon. Once the final details were finalized with the real estate agent, I immediately went to the local RONA hardware store to buy a rake for leaves. I looked forward to raking the dead leaves, which had been accumulating on the ground for the past three years as the house had been without an owner for all that time.

When I arrived at the RONA, a big strapping lad-the owner-welcomed me and sold me the rake in question, and a wooden handle. And we got acquainted for the first time. André was, without question, more than six feet tall. A giant.

Once we moved in I adopted the village hardware store for all my purchases. Then one day, Mr. Laberge spoke to me about his problems with the town of Huntingdon, then his neighbour, the CIBC bank, which refused to give him his right of way. Typical over the fence squabbling! He entrusted me with the file, and we had it settled. Then it was alarm problems at

Over the years, we had become close friends. A little like my older brother whom I have never had.

Then in the spring of 2003, André asked me, in the name of several businesses in town, to appear "against the Big Brunette" (the "Big Brunette" being the mayor for the past two terms). They wanted things to move and change. He said to me point blank: "We need a lad like you. You went to school, you are a lawyer and you know how politics works. I did some politics when I was younger, and I know that you would be okay for our town."

I thought about it then I accepted.

André Laberge supported me throughout the campaign. On election night, November 2, 2003, he had organized without my knowledge a huge celebration at Wayne's, the Brasserie du Village. When the results of the ballots were revealed, we hugged each other. He cried warm tears... of enjoyment!

I regularly visited André at his store or the Brasserie. We smoked "Indians" together. We even smoked in the store and chatted about the town and politics. We laughed and we talked about everything and nothing. There was never a week that would pass without our counter caucus.

André would also come to see me at the town half. It was like a ceremony, an honour for him to come to the Mayor's office. Yet all that I have today is a little and especially thanks to him. It was the spark from his idea that got me started.

One morning in the winter of 2005, André was passing by the town hall with his black pick-up truck. He saw me coming out the side door and stopped his vehicle. He lowered the window and looked at me, his eyes were full of water. He had just learned he had black spots on his lungs... but that he was confident he was going to get over it. That he was going to fight and be cured.

Then some weeks later, he told me he didn't want to "surrender" until the next municipal election and for me to be reelected. And that later, that's when he could leave...

We continued to see each other here and there. At St-Jean last year at Prince - Arthur Park, he was happy to see me. Another time it was at the Brasserie. We had lunch together. We didn't have much to say. I felt uncomfortable leaving him like that. And no doubt him too.

Before going on holidays last Monday, I sent him flowers at the Huntingdon County Hospital where he was staying. It was a beautiful boat of flowers because he was a fanatic for Valleyfield's Regatta.

It was in a five-minute conversation with the town's clerk for news that she told me that André had died.

I had no courage to visit you in your last hours. I did not want to cry in front of you. I love you and I appreciate you had confidence in me.
