Mayor of St. Jean Chrysostome dies suddenly

The Municipality of St. Jean Chrysostome Parish was shattered by the news of the sudden death of its mayor, Robert Décosse, during the early morning hours of Sunday, Nov. 17.

Mr. Décosse who was only 43 years old, was mayor of St. Jean Chrysostome since November 1983. He had

just been reelected by acclamation for a second term on Nomination Day, October 28.

He leaves to mourn his wife, Reine-Aimée, and four daughters.

The funeral service will take place today, Wednesday, Nov. 20, at 2:30 p.m. in the Parish Church

of St. Chrysostome.

The municipality has eight days to publish notice of election for a new mayor but there's no time limit as to when the election must be held.

The municipal council, now headed by pro-mayor Gerard Giroux, will hold a special meeting on Thursday evening, Nov. 21.
