Claude Garault was long-time Havelock mayor

It was with great regret that the population of the Haut St. Laurent region learned of the passing of former Havelock mayor Claude Garault. At age 52, he died after a worsening sickness on January 4 in St. Jean sur Richelieu.

On the municipal scene, Claude Garault was an important political figure, knowing well the regional point of view. He served the region as prefect of the Huntingdon County Council before working hard to put into place the new administrative structure known as the MRC.

Upon retirement from the municipal world, he could easily say "mission accomplished" because he had successfully maintained the municipality of Havelock in good standing among its neighbouring municipalities of the South-

west Quebec region.

In his last interview with The Gleaner/La Gazette he said he was leaving politics without a happy heart but maybe someday he would return.

At the last meeting of the MRC Haut St. Laurent on January 9, the present

Havelock Mayor, Gerald Beaudoin, who worked alongside Claude Garault for many years as Secretary-Treasurer, asked the other mayors to keep a special thought in their prayers for Claude Garault.

He leaves his spouse Carmen Desrosiers and

children Alain (Francine Nadeau), Josée (Benoit Mathieu) and his brother Michel (Mireille Faille). He leaves also grandchildren Benjamin, Guillaume and Jeremie as well as a crowd of friends who knew him during his passage on this earth.
