One dead, four hurt in Noyan accident

A St-Bernard-de-Lacolle man is dead and four other people injured following a Sunday-night two-car accident in the Noyan area.

Georges Menard, 65, was killed when one vehicle failed to stop at the intersection of Rtes. 202 and 225 about 8 p.m.

Stephanie McLelland, 20, of Clarenceville was injured and taken to the St-Jean-sur-Richelieu Regional Hospital, and were Noyan residents in the other car: Pierre Frenette, 47, his wife Nicole, 46, and their 10 year-old son Martin.

All four were seriously hurt, said a spokesman for the Lacolle office of the Sûreté de Québec, adding that a coroner's report will determine whether any charges will be laid.
