Obituary

Frederick Armstrong, 86, is mourned in Dundee

Friends and family of the late Frederick J. Armstrong gathered at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Huntingdon on Wednesday, Apr. 3 at 1:30 p.m., to celebrate his life and mourn his passing.

The Rev. Kate Jordan officiated and read scriptures from Psalm 121, Revelation 21 and from the Gospel of St. Luke. She provided a message based on a passage from a favorite book of Fred's, authored by Jimmy Carter. The choir led the congregation in the singing of "The Lord Is My Shepherd" and "Guide Me, O Thou Great Redeemer". Pall-bearers were Cary Carpentier, Ian Ferns, Victor Latreille, Alfred Latulipe, Keith McPherson, and Arthur Rankin.

Fred was born in Montreal on December 15, 1915 and was married to Olita Cappiello of Fort Covington, New

York, in December of 1941. Besides his wife, he is survived by his son Winston (Jean) of Dundee, and his daughter Martha (Douglas) of Sackville, N. B.; grandsons Merrill and Scott Bruce, grand-daughter Erin; one brother, Pierce of Manchester, Conn., sisters-in-law, one brother-in-law, several nieces, nephews and cousins. He was predeceased by his parents, a sister, Catherine, and a brother, Winston.

Fred served in the Royal Canadian Air Force from 1941 to 1945, and returned to Dundee to work the family farm. He was active in his community throughout his 86 years and took pride in his involvement in the Zion Cemetery Committee. Fred was well known in later years as a local historian and assisted many who were researching their genealogy.
